Remember, this is your short-hand, so use abbreviations, symbols or anything that you’ll remember later. • Put the number of the verse beside each fact. • Use significant words straight from scripture. • This section should be very close to re-writing the verse itself. It’s what God is saying without adding our own thoughts. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What are the spiritual truths or principles in this verse? <p>S—Is there a sin to confess? P—Is there a promise to keep? A—Is there an action to take? C—Is there a command that I need to heed? E—Is there an example to follow or not to follow?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How will I act on this lesson? • Write open ended questions—ones that can’t be answered with “yes” or “no” • Take time to pray and listen. Write a response to each question.
